Kia Ora Tatou,

Here we are a day away from our April Holidays!

It has been a great term with student behaviour improving markedly from 2018.

We are still working daily to remind our students to Be Respectful, Responsible, Safe and Confident. To reward the students for their improved behaviour we are working with Counties Manukau Sport tomorrow who will run a 'Have a go Day.'

In teams, the children will work in 90 minute blocks to play sports such as Football, Hockey, Basketball & Rugby League.

New Deputy Principal:

As mentioned in Newsletter # 4, Sarah Poutai has resigned her position as Deputy Principal of Pukekohe Intermediate School to care for her whanau at present.

We have begun advertising for a new Deputy Principal and hope to have this position filled and ready to commence in Term 3 2019. In education, we must give 8 weeks' notice when leaving a teaching position and before taking up a new role.

The Board of Trustees aims to have appointed the new person to the position by mid-May and then the new Deputy Principal can provide the 2 months' notice that they intend on leaving and taking up their new position with us.

Room 4 will be taught by Kiah Saunders for Term 2 until our new Deputy Principal and Teacher of Room 4 can commence.

In the meantime, Hayley Kahui and Nicky Twiss will act as relieving Deputy Principals.


