
SYMMETRY

WATCH THIS VIDEO ON SYMMETRY

Something is symmetrical when it is the same on both sides. A shape has symmetry if **a central dividing line (a mirror line) can be drawn on it**, to show that both sides of the shape are exactly the same


SYMMETRICAL SHAPES

Ask your teacher or parent for a piece of paper. Fold the paper in half and draw half your shape, lining it up with the middle of the page. Draw a butterfly, heart, square, rectangle, triangle etc, using a dark (black) pastel or crayon. Once, you have folded the page, you can then use a pencil or ice block stick to rub the lines of your shape onto the other side. (tracing it through the paper.) You can then get an outline on the blank side of your paper. Fill this in and you have your symmetrical butterfly.

A mirror line is a line which can be drawn onto a shape to show that both sides have exact reflective symmetry. It is called a 'mirror' line because it acts in exactly the same way a normal mirror does, reflecting a figure and flipping it symmetrically so that it faces the other way and retains its shape.

This video will teach you about mirror symmetry. Fold a piece paper in half and draw a shape on one side and then copy this shape on the other side.





Use of adverbs, "I washed my hair as quickly as I could, so I could get my haircut."
