Student Voice:

At the end of Term 3 annually, we ask our students about their feelings of school and about their learning.

Here is what they said:

Question	Percentage Responding Positively (Expect 70%)
Do you like coming to school?	83.4% of our students
Does your teacher like you?	82.9% of our students thought so
Do you feel safe in the playground?	68.1% felt safe. (A problem area)
Are you improving with your basic facts	73.0% described improvements
Is your Mathematics getting better?	78.6% of students saw good progress
Are you getting better at spelling?	82.1% were positive about this.
Is your writing improving?	83.4% saw improvements
Are you progressing in your reading?	88.2% stated good progress in their reading

Whilst we are happy to see 70-75% OF OUR STUDENTS responding positively about school and their learning, it was wonderful to, in most cases see our students responding around or over the 80% mark.

Our real focus is our playground where recently we had a surge of fighting!

This has not been the case until the final weeks of Term 3 and beginning weeks of Term 4. We have restricted play in certain areas and spoken to the children again about expectations on them all of being Safe, Respectful, Responsible and Confident.

Things have begun to improve in playground behaviour.

We asked the tamariki what we could do to keep on improving our kura. Here are some of their replies.
