### **Staffing for Term 1 2020:**

We heard from Matua Henare King just after New Year that he had a month stay in Waikato Hospital and has requested Leave of Absence from the Board of Trustees through Term 1 as he recuperates. He is healing well and we do expect to see him on site if on restricted hours as the term wears on. We wish Henare the speediest of recoveries and a return to full health soon.

Annette Iqbal has tendered her resignation as of the end of March 2020 as she takes on a new role as an Early Childhood Teacher locally.

Annette had an eventful 2019 where she had to deal with two ailing family members. Her time is taken up with providing her care for her whanau.

We have begun advertising for a replacement teacher for Room 11.

As a strategic action, The Board of Trustees agreed to release Nicky Twiss from fulltime class teaching in 2020.

Nicky will focus upon developing a new oral language programme that Pukekohe North School began trialling in late 2019, liaising with Early Childhood Centres such as Best Start –Dublin Street and Kids Count.

Nicky will also work with our Learning Support students and assist the staff to develop their Literacy Programmes.

During the holidays we advertised for, interviewed and appointed Jan Ahern, an experienced Junior School teacher who has recently worked for Drury School.

Jan will commence with us in March and take over Room 12 from 30 March.

In the meantime Annette and Nicky are working Room 11- 12 together as low class numbers allow at present.

### **Curriculum Focus:**

Pukekohe North School staff are working with Mentors from Massey University on the Developing Mathematical Inquiry Communities. (DMIC)

This follows the celebrated work of Dr Roberta Hunter who worked closely with Maori / Pasifika Communities to lift the achievement of their students.

Dr 'Bobbie" has appeared on TV numerous times to talk about her mathematical approach that requests students to attempt problem solving situations within multi-levelled collaborative groups and attack problems ABOVE the students' classroom achievement levels.

Our staff are underway with this already in their classrooms and will continue to work with our mentors throughout 2020.

## **Focus upon Attendance- Uniforms and Homework:**

Pukekohe North School has joined with Pukekohe Intermediate School, Puni, Hill School and Pukekohe High School in seeking a 90% Attendance rate for all of our students.

Students to achieve academically should have no more than 4-5 days away from school per term. The above schools have partnered with The Solomon Group and The New Zealand Police to work with whanau to ensure students who should be at school are attending at the 90% mark.

We have had a wonderful start to 2020 and students are looking great in their uniforms. We want our students to be proud of their school and to wear their uniform with pride.

Please ensure students are attending daily in the proper Pukekohe North School uniform.

I have asked our teachers to provide students with regular homework.

EVERY day the students MUST be reading at home, and practising their Basic Facts  $(4 + 7, 5 + 9, 2 \times 8, 9 \times 9)$  etc) as well as their spelling lists daily.

## **Coronavirus Update from the Ministry of Health:**

## How do I protect myself and my family?

Everyone should protect themselves from the virus, as you would for the 'flu -

- 2 Washing your hands regularly, or using hand sanitiser, is the best way to avoid this illness.
