Kia Ora Tatou,

We are back to school BUT not as normal for at least another week! We began on Monday 18 May with just 115 /292 students and as of today, we have 170 students on site



School Programming under COVID-19 Alert Level 2

School opens daily at 8.20.a.m. with the children entering school via the Beatty Road Gate.

We check the tamariki as they enter screening for sniffles, coughs and runny noses.

The children hand sanitise and head off to class.

We have split the school into two Groups A and B.

Group A has their playground time separately from Group B and we have divided the school day into x 3 Blocks so the students can get used to being back and studying but with regular breaks in their day. The children are educated in staying an arm's length away from their classmates. Classrooms are established to keep the arm's length away from one another.

Hand washing is regular:

- -On entering the classroom -After going to the toilet -Before eating
- -After coughing or sneezing

All visitors that enter our school must register and hand sanitise. These procedures will remain in place until at least Friday 29 May.

COVID -19 Updates:

We are postponing some usual school activities and events until we get clearance from the Ministry of Education in the next 1-2 weeks.

We have stopped Bible in School classes and School assemblies.

We have set up the Government's new Tracker App by providing a QR Code at our main Entrance and again at the hall for any whanau needing to be on site at all.

Whanau will need to down load the App from Play Store to use this function.

The Ministry of Education are informing us that they have 206 Modems / Devices making their way to your homes. These devices are owned by Pukekohe North School.

The modems are provided free of charge for 6 months. If you wish to keep the modems after that period, you will need to continue the payments to connect to the internet.

Please let us know if we can assist your whanau with the setting up of the modems and devices.

This Term is 12 weeks long taking into consideration that we spent 5 weeks of that time learning from home.
