- Te Reo Maori me ona Tikanga (e.g Powhiri/Karakia/ Waiata/ Marae Whanau/Turangawaewae)
- Toi Maori (Moari Arts/ Kowhaiwhai/ Haka/Mau Rakau/Tukutuku)
- Tamaoho Haerenga (e.g Pratt Road/ Nga Hau E Wha Marae/Visits to significant places)
- Pakiwaitara (e.g Ăko/Mihimihi/Mana Orite/ Whakapapa)



We aim to review again halfway through Term 2 and see if we combine as a whole school under a single timetable from Week 6 onwards.


<u>KiwiCan:</u>
