#### Tumuaki Talk

Kia Ora Whanau,

I have been reviewing our attendance data and we have increased our attendance percentage from 73% to 77% across term 3.

What makes this even more special is that the New Zealand's national overall attendance level is 46.1%

Moreover, we have 73 students who are attending at 90% or greater and 33 students who have yet to miss a day at school this term! We have done so well!

Thank you whaanau for sending children to school daily. Our target is 90% attendance on average for Pukekohe North School!

#### Positive Behaviour for Learning

When our students break a school expectation, we record their names and the rule broken on our student management system.

This term, with over 300 pupils at our school, our staff have only recorded 13 offences.

Last term we recorded a very low 39 incidents across 3 months. I thank our students for their great behaviour and focused attitudes to learn and improve.

#### Vaping

We have had four or five instances of our tamariki suspected of vaping.

I have collected x 4 vapes from students at the beginning of this week. We know that vaping is rife amongst teenagers and Intermediate aged students.

It is illegal for tamariki to purchase, smoke or vape under 18 years of age.

Our Senior Staff are organising a Health Representative to talk to our students about the dangers of smoking/vaping and the damage that cigarettes and e-cigarettes can cause to our bodies.

Please talk to your tamariki about this.

#### **Breakfast Club**


Throughout the term, our kaiako/teachers have been providing breakfast for the tamariki in their

teams. We are supplying breakfast to over 50 aakonga per day. With the shift in COVID-19 protocols,

we believe it is time to get our Breakfast Club up and functioning from the hall each day.

Here is how you can help. We need volunteers to assist with the running of the breakfast club. 3-4 volunteers per day, set up the hall with tables and chairs, make the toast and put out the milk forcereals and spreads for the toast. Afterwards, it's a matter of placing the dishes in the dishwasher, a wipe down of all services and placing the cutlery and crockery away. Time wise, this covers about 90 minutes from 7.45 to 9.15.a.m.

The wonderful people at New World Pukekohe and in particular Owner Tim and Manager Mike are providing all the kai required for Breakfast Club for the next 12 months.



Moreover, they are putting their hands up to cover the Wednesday Breakfast Club duty.

We now need to cover Monday-Tuesday and Friday. We will commence slowly in the first two weeks of Term 4 offering breakfasts on Wednesdays (19 and the 26 Oct) and Thursdays (20 and 27 October) We will continue to provide breakfasts in classrooms on the other days until we are fully operational.


