
Breeze and Michelle will be stationed in Room 17 and commence their programme on Tuesday 7 February.

2023-2025 STRATEGIC PLAN

I am excited about our plans to improve and progress our kura! the improvements we are aiming to make include:

1. Raising our achievement rates to:

Tuhituhi = 72% Achieving At or Above the expectation Writing = 55% Achieving At or Above the expectation Panui = 85% Achieving At or Above the expectation Reading = 60% Achieving At or Above the expectation Pangarau = 57% Achieving At or Above the expectation Mathematics = 56% Achieving At or Above the expectation

- Establish our new Student Management System HERO to track aakonga progress in 6 monthly sign-posted steps
- 3. Our kaiako to write our Aotearoa/ New Zealand Histories, Health / Physical Education, and visual Art 2-year Cycle Curriculums
- 4. Continue our staff professional development programmes in Developing Mathematics Inquiry Communities (DMIC) and Accelerating Progress in Mathematics (ALIM)
- Elimination of bullying, discrimination, racism, but, being inclusive.


BEING SUNSMART AT PNS
