## ATTENDANCE AT PUKEKOHE NORTH SCHOOL

In the past 18 months, we have raised our attendance rate from 60% to 82%! This is fantastic and vitally important as we aim at raising achievement levels across our school.

Each Term, we reward students who have attended at 90% or above each term.

At our final assembly, if I was to adhere to this figure, I would have handed out 140 certificates and prizes!!!

I, therefore, restricted presentations to our tamariki who had attended 99-100% of Term 1 2023. This culminated in over 40 certificates being presented.

Should your tamariki need to have 3 or more days away from school, teachers will expect a medical note to be provided on the aakonga attendance back at school.
